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About the Author

Tim Richards has been active on the jazz scene since the early 1980s and is best known for his leadership of the modern jazz group 'Spirit Level', formed in Bristol in 1979, which toured in almost every European country, playing original material in jazz clubs and at festivals opposite such names as Joe Zawinul, McCoy Tyner, Joe Henderson, Horace Silver, Miles Davis and Jan Garbarek.

In recent years he has won acclaim as a composer and arranger, in 1999 expanding 'Spirit Level' to a nine-piece band and renaming it 'Great Spirit'. This band has toured the UK several times with a line-up featuring some of London's best jazz musicians, many of whom are band leaders in their own right.

Tim also enjoys playing in the more traditional setting of the piano trio, with bass and drums, and has released two acclaimed CDs of standards, blues and originals on the 33 label (see below). The trio has delighted audiences from Istanbul to Inverness and continues to perform frequently.

Tim currently teaches jazz piano classes at London's Morley and Goldsmiths' Colleges. He has pieces in the Associated Board's jazz piano syllabus and also works for the AB as a jazz examiner.
